HELP OTHERS

In 2010, more than 70,000 individuals received assistance from a United Way-funded agency. Results from three of the 69 programs are highlighted below.

- 85% of individuals and families participating in Catholic Charities' counseling program demonstrated improvement within an issue/problem based on a treatment plan.
- 77% of individuals participating in Family Service of Waukesha's consumer credit counseling program avoided bankruptcy through financial counseling.
- 82% of seniors and adults with disabilities participating in Interfaith Senior Programs' faith in action program indicated that chore services helped them remain living independently.
